In the Name of God Amen I Turner Jackson of Charles City County being sick and weak but of perfect sense and memory calling to mind that it is appointed for all men to die. I do recommend to almighty God my soul who gave it me and my body to be buried in christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors and for what worldly estate it has please God to endow me with I give in the manner and form as follows

Item I give my Will is that all my stock of horses, cattle, sheep and hogs and all my household furniture be sold and the money arising to pay my Just Debts and after my Debts are paid the overplus money to be equally divided amongs all my children to wit Thomas, John, Turner, Martha, Caty and Sarah Jackson to them and their heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my sister in law Sarah Major my side Saddle that was my wives to her and her heirs for ever.

Item my will is that my land and my negro woman Temp be hired out to the highest bidder untill my son Thomas or as it may happen my son John or Turner comes to Lawfull age and the money arising to help bring up my children and when my eldest son comes to age then my will is that my land and my negro Woman Temp and her increase to be sold and the money arising to be equally divided amongst all my children Thomas, John, Turner, Martha, Caty and Sarah Jackson to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly I do appoint my loving friends Samuel Major and John Major Just. whole and sole Exors of this my last will & Testament revoking all other wills hereto before made by me as Witnesse my hand and seal this 7th Day of March 1766

The above written Last Will and Testament of Turner Jackson deceased was presented in court by John Jackson and Nathl Gregory, and being proved by the oaths of William Woodcock (and Susan^{her}na Woodcock whose name at the time of her being a witness to the same was present) two of the witnesses thereto, is ordered to be recorded, and it appearing to the court that the Executors named in the said Will, refused to take upon themselves the Execution thereof, on the motion of the said John Jackson and Nathl Gregory who made oath to the same according to Law certificate is granted them for obtaining Letters of Administration (with the said Will annexed) on the Estate of the said Turner Jackson, on their giving security, whereupon they together with Littlebury Hardymanlyer and Joel Christian their securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of One hundred pounds current money with condition according to Law.
