this to be my last will and Testament in maner an^d form following

hoping thro the merit and intercessions of my blessed Saviour to receive Pardon
and Remission for all my sins and as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God
to bestow upon me I give devise and dispose thereof in manner following

I give unto my well beloved wife Frances Scott after payment of my Debts an^d Legacies
the use of all an^d singular my estate including my Land etc an^d after her death I give
the land to my son W^m Scott and the rest of my estate that she shall Possess at her death
I desire may be equally divided between my two sons Robert an^d Jesse Scott In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand an^d affix my seal this 22 day
of February 1769
