In the name of God Amen I William West of the County of Charles City and Parish of Westover being sick and weak but of perfect sense and memory do make and constitute this my last will and testament in manner and form as followeth: I give, give and bequeath the use of all my estate both real & personal to my Loving wife Mary West during her her widowhood provided she Educates and maintains my four children namely William West, Edward West, John West and Peter West till they arrive to the age of fifteen years and then, my will and desire is that three of my said sons be bound out to good trades, namely, Edward, John & Peter by their Guardians till the attain to Lawfull age and my son William I desire should live with my loving wife or bound to a trade at her discretion, and after the marriage of my said wife I send her the use of one third part of my whole Estate during her natural life. I give to my Children that shall be bound to trade, ten pounds, to be raised out of the profits of my Estate

if sufficient, if not, out of my estate, to be laid out in working tools by their Guardians and equally divided amongst them when they attain to lawfull age. I give and devise unto my son William West the Land and plantation whereon I now live, after the death of my living Wife, to him and his heirs forever. I give and devise a litle Rest of my estate of what kind soever to be equally divided between my three sons namely, Edward, John and Peter to them & their heirs forever.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my living Wife Executrix and my brother John West and William Green Munford, Executors to this my last Will and Testament, and I desire that my Son may be Guardian to my within mentioned Children I Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1 day of December in the year of our Lord 1771
