 out yearly and the money equally divided among the children of my brother Jeffery.
 Also I give and bequeath to my brother Jeffery Gilliam all the residue of my
 estate of every kind whatsoever at my decease. I do hereby constitute my brother
 Jeffery sole Executor of this my last will and Testament, ratifying ^{confirming} this and no other
