Brayne Williams's
Will

In the name of God, amen. I Brayne Williams, of the
County of Charles city, and Parish of Westover, reflecting on the uncertain-
ty of human life, do make and advise this writing to be my last Will,
and Testament. Inprimis. I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son
Brayne Williams Payer, my Land and plantation whereon I now live,
with all its appurtenances therunto belonging, to him; the said Brayne
W. Payer and his heirs forever, reserving the use of the said Land and
plantation to my son in Law Samuel Payer during the minority, or holibaup
of my said grand son Brayne W. Payer, but as soon as my said grand
son shall arrive to lawful age, or marry, he the said Brayne W. Payer
shall have possession of the aforesaid Land, and plantation in as ample
a manner as if I had not given the use of the said Land to my
son in Law Samuel Payer, during the nonage or single life of my said
grand son Brayne W. Payer, but if my said grand son Brayne
W. Payer should die before he arrives to the age, of one and twenty years,
and without heir lawfully begotten of his — body, then I give and
bequeath my aforesaid Land, and plantation to my grand Daughter Elizabeth
Smallwood, to her and her heirs forever; Nevertheless my meaning is, that
provided my grand son Brayne W. Payer, should die before he arrives
to —

to lawful age, and without lawful heir of his body, yet my son in Law Samuel Payer shall not be out of the use of the aforesaid land, and plantation by my grand Daughter Elizabeth Smallwood, until the expiration of the time my aforesaid grand son Brazure W. Payer would have arrived to the age of twenty one years, provided he had lived. —

Item. I give and bequeath unto my grand son Brazure W. Payer the following slaves, to wit, Phill, Will, Sam, young Fant, James & Alley, also three Guns, called Beau, Dandridge, and little Dutch gun, one buffie pot, one Bed, and furniture, one large copper Kettle, and one pair of large Sledges, to him the said Brazure W. Payer and his heirs forever. —

Item. I give and bequeath unto my grand Daughter, Elizabeth Smallwood the following slaves, to wit, Ned, Fench and all her increase Sarah, Pat, and Ischem to her the said Elizabeth Smallwood & her heirs forever. —


Item. I lend unto my wife Francis Williams during her natural life, the following slaves, and personal estate, to wit, Dick, old Fant, Phill, Jude, Bet, Phillis, Beck, Grace, and Venus, one Bed, and furniture, two pots, six plates, four Dishes, a riding chain, six bows, and balves, two work Steers, three sows and pigs, six sheep, six Geese, six dunghill fowls, one Case, and Bottles, and a Bull, and at the decease of my said wife my will and desire is that the slaves and personal estate, except Grace, and Venus, Grace after the death of my wife I give to my grand son Brazure W. Payer and his heirs forever. Venus, after the death of my wife, I give to my grand daughter Elizabeth Smallwood, and her heirs forever. The balance of the slaves & personal estate I before willed to my wife, my will is after her death, shall be equally divided between my two grand children, Brazure W. Payer, and Elizabeth Smallwood to them and their heirs forever. —

Item. I lend to my wife Francis Williams during her natural life, one third part of my Land, and plantation herein before given to my grand son Brazure W. Payer, but this Loan is not in any manner to alter, or affect the aforesaid bequest of the said Land and plantation to my said grand son Brazure W. Payer, more than to postpone his possessing the said one third part, allotted to my wife until after her death. —

Item. My will and desire is that my Executors hereafter named, do collect all debts due to me, and from the said collection, pay all Just debts due from me to others. My will is that all the residue of my Estate of what kind soever that —

that is not mentioned before, be sold and the money arising from such sale together with the surplus from the collection of my debts, if any after all my just debts are paid, be equally divided between my two grand Children, to wit, Brazaire W. Pryor and Elizabeth Smallwood. — My will and desire is, provided my two grand Children, to wit, Brazaire W. Pryor, and Elizabeth Smallwood should both die without issue, lawfully begotten of their bodies, then and in that case, I give all my estate, both real, and personal, to be equally divided between all my Brothers, and sisters Children who shall then be living. — Item My will is provided my son in Law Samuel Pryor, should ever intermarry with Mary Johnson, daughter of John Johnson deceased, then and in that case only, he the said Samuel Pryor shall not have the ^{use} of the before mentioned Lands, and plantation during the nonage, or single life of my said grand son Brazaire W. Pryor, but it shall descend to my said grand son in the same manner as tho' my son in Law Samuel Pryor was not mentioned in my will at all. — Lastly I constitute and appoint my two sons in Law John Smallwood and Samuel Pryor Executors of this my last will and testament, revoking all others by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal, this 20th day of July in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and ninety. —
