make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following. Viz
I desire that my negro man Minor, as also all my other property be kept for the
support and benefit of my three Children to wit, Samuel, Patience, and Rebecca, that
is to say none of the said property to be sold but the same together with the
negro Minor to be acted with by my executor for the benefit of my said Child
giving to each of them unequal proportion of the same and should either of my
said Children die without heir or arrival to lawful age then such proportion I give
unto my surviving Child or Children to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I
nominate constitute and appoint William Graves my whole and sole executor
of this my last will and testament in witness my hand and seal this 7th day
March 1800
