In the name of God Amen I Francis Durfey being weak in body, though in perfect mind and memory calling to mind that all men are once to die; do make and ordain my Will this my last will and testament, utterly revoking all other this twenty first day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred. First I recommend my soul to God and my body to be decently buried by my executors; as to my worldly goods with which it has pleased God to possess me, I give and bequeath as follows to wit. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Durfey the plantation wheron I now live, and the land lying on the same side of the road with the house, to her and her heirs forever, and all the residue of my estate I leave to be sold for the payment my debts and if any remains after the debts are paid to be equally divided amongst all my children. I make and appoint Robert Chandler and Edward Walker, executors to this my last will and testament.

At a monthly Court held for Charles City County at the Courthouse  
on Thursday the 19th day of June 1780, The aforeswitten last Will &  
Testament of Francis Dinsley deceased was put into court by Robert  
Chandler and Edward Walker the executors therein named, and  
being proved by the oath of Charles Parish one of the witnesses -  
that he is continued for further proof; and on the motion of the said  
Executors, who made oath as the law directs, certificate is granted them  
for obtaining a probate thereof in due form, and thereupon they together  
with William Monckton, and John Timberlake their securities entered  
into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of two thousand  
dollars conditioned as the law directs, and at a Quarterly Court  
held for said County at the Courthouse on Thursday the 21st day of  
May 1781, the said Will was further proved by the oath of Stephen  
Huck another witness thereto and ordered to be recorded.

In the name of God Amen, I James Barlow of Charles City County  
being of sound mind do make and constitute this to be my last will  
and testament, in manner and form following to wit, to that almighty  
Creator, who gave me being I recommend myself to his mercy and pro-  
tection, and as to my temporal possessions dispose of them as follows:  
James Barlow Will.

Item, to my much esteemed wife I leave the whole of my negro's except  
one by name Esther, until my eldest Son comes of age, or marries &  
when that shall happen, in that case the negro's of my estate shall  
be equally divided between my wife Aggy & my two Sons, to wit William  
Toukens Barlow & James Barlow, it is in that case my meaning that  
if my eldest Son comes of age, or marries, or in case he should die before  
either of the two things happen, then in that case, when ever my  
youngest son comes of age, or marries, that my wife shall have the negro's  
divide, as the law directs in case a man dies intestate, giving to my  
wife one third, for and during the term of her natural Life, at the  
termination of which, then to go to my two sons, or their issue & the other  
two thirds divided between my said Sons William Toukens Barlow and  
James Barlow. - Item it is my will and desire that my wife shall  
keep together the whole of my household and Kitchen furniture and all  
my stock of every kind, hogs, horses, cattle &c. and not sold until my  
said Son, or Sons comes of age, or marries & then for my wife to divide the  
same, keeping one third part to herself, during her life & the other two -  
thirds equally divided between my two sons, or in case of either of them
