Will

I Eady Willis son^r of Charles City County being in a low state of health, but of sound sense and memory do make and order this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth Wiz^t. Impensis I give to my children namely Rodger London, David Limes, Doctor, Billy Willis one shilling

shelling such to them and their heirs forever. — Item. I give the use of my Land to Jofe and Betty Willis during the life of my said son Jofe Willis and after his death to my daughter Betty Willis to her and her heirs forever with this exception, that the said Betty shall not debar my son Jofe from tending her Land as he does his own, as long as he lives, but if she refuses that privilege, I lend the whole of my Land to my ^{said} son Jofe during his life, and after his death to my said daughter Betty to her and her heirs forever. — Item I give to my daughter Betty Willis one feather Bed, my Loom, one large Pt. Box iron and heaters, Spoon - Moulds, one Pewter Basin to her and her heirs forever. — Item all the remaining part of my Estates that is not above devised and given away I give to my son Jofe Willis & my daughter Betty Willis equally to them and their heirs forever. — Item I constitute and appoint my son Jofe Willis Executor to this my last Will and Testament. — In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 25th day of November 1795. — Signed sealed and acknowledged.

At a Monthly Court held for Charles City County on Thursday eighteenth day of December 1794, The afores written last Will and Testament of Eady Willis deceased was this day proved by the affirmation of William Ladd and Joseph Clegg two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded. — And on the motion of Jofe Willis the Executor therein named and making oath thereto as the Law directs, and together with James Ladd sen^r his neather entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Twenty pounds with such condition as the Law in such cases directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form. —
