We the undersigned, equally to a order of the worshipful Court of Charles City County to its clerks, have collected and laid off by special agreement of the parties to Mrs. Elizabeth Howood the fee use and enjoyment of the land from the lower top of the hill down the swamp, run at the south end of the plantation, along the line of Amos but shall collect through to the first up fence as it now stands, running by an old sapid pear tree, near the place where the Perkins house formerly stood, thence along the line which divides it from the lands of John Minger to the lower top of the hill, and along the ridge brow or top of the hill to the beginning for the term of the space of two years from the first day of January 1805 after which term the said Elizabeth agrees to relinquish and give up the aforementioned lot or parcel of land with all houses & thereon and take as her portion and only right of access, that portion now occupied by John Harris, and all the lands lying to the North of the said field, and bounded by the lands of Francis Middleton, Edward Hager, and at the representation of Samuel Howood, Esq. by John Withers, holder of the reversionary right agreeing to have her house placed upon that which John Harris now lives, built with ft. of pine, and covered with shingles, the house to be thirty feet in length fourteen feet in breadth, eight feet pitch, and floored above and below with two chimneys of wood, and to sink her a well with a sweep. As the said Withers has from this date the right to the unfinished dwelling house and from the North East corner of the said house to a large pine on the line of Amos but shall, and all the lands below to the swamp, a run which divides it from the lands of John Minger, and two of the barns and one half of the manure now on the plantation, and all the pastures and use of the land, not allotted to the said Elizabeth, the yard as now enclosed to be used mutually. It is now directed by the parties and agreed to by the said Elizabeth, that she shall divide in two equal parts, the land or parts allotted her for the space of two years from the first day of Jan'y 1805, and tend them alternately, keep them and require a main enclosure. The said Elizabeth has the right to cut fire woods, below the hill or elsewhere for the term of two years from the 1st day of January 1805 but in doing this she shall not cut a log fit for timber of any kind as rails staves &c. And it is further understood and agreed to by the parties, that the said Withers may cut and carry away any timber for building or otherwise as he may choose taking care to allow the said Elizabeth a sufficiency of sapwood, rail timber and timber for repairs a buildings on the said land. This applies only to that part of the land which she is to be put in possession of after the first day of January 1807.
