In the name of God Amen Elizabeth Burton of the county of Charles City being sick and weak but of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following: My soul I recommend to Almighty God who gave it me, hoping through the merits and intercession of my blessed saviour Jesus Christ to obtain a pardon for all my offences towards God and Man - My body to be committed to the earth and decently buried at the direction of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as to the worldly estate which it has pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in manner and form following -

Imprimis I give and bequeath to Bolling New my overseer my young mare as satisfaction for the hindrance by me caused on the plantation as also one sixth part of the crop which was our former bargain to him & his heirs for ever -

Item my last and desire is that as soon as the money can be raised by my Executors hereafter mentioned that they pay Col. William Randolph of this county twenty six pounds one shilling with interest on the same as it was money lent me, also pay my just debts and funeral expences - My will and desire further is that the remaining part of my estate be divided between my two daughters Mary Burton and Elizabeth Walker to them and their heirs for ever -

Lastly I do hereby appoint my friends Ralph Burton and Henry Armistead Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand & affix my seal this tenth day of January one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight.

witnes thereto and ordered to be recorded and the executor named in the said will appearing in court and refusing to take upon themselves the burthen of the execution thereof and it further appearing to the satisfaction of the court that the persons entitled by law to the right of administration refuse to accept the same, on the motion of Edward Marston Williams who made oath according to law and together with James Walker and John Timblylake his securities entered into and acknowledge their bond in the penalty of one thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining Letters of administration on the estate of the said Elizabeth Burton deceased with her said will annexed in due form.
