 In the of God amen. I Elizabeth Carters of the Parish of Westover and the County of Charles City, being in sound mind and memory, doth make this my last Will and Testament, and doth give and bequeath all my estate in manner and form following to wit. — I give to my daughter Sarah Holt one pound five shillings to her and her heirs forever. Item, I give to Anne Ann Gregory daughter to my Grandson Samuel Gregory my best Bed and furniture, Two choice hogs and calves, Two pewter dishes a half dozen pewter plates and a copper Tea Kettle, to her and her heirs forever. Item, I give to my Grandson Saml Gregory one Negroe Boy Sam, and all the residue of my estate: whatever it may be, to him and his heirs for ever. I doth constitute and appoint Samuel Gregory my Executor to this my last Will and Testament. It is my Will and desire, that there should be no Inventory and appraisement of my estate. Given under my hand and seal this ninth day of February 1791.

At a Quarterly Court held for Charles City County at the Court House on Friday the sixteenth day of March 1792.

The aforesaid last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Carter deceased was proved by the Oaths of Hith Hardyman, Hermon Bosman and William Oglesby the Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded; and the motion of Samuel Gregory the Executor therein named, who made Oath according to law, and together with Hith Hardyman and Dunbar Gordon his Securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds, conditional as the Law directs. Certificate is Granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form.
