 the Uncertainty of human Life and being at this time in
 perfect health do make and ordain this my last Will and
 Testament. In the first place unworthy as I am I resign
 my Soul into the hands of its Creator humbly hoping for its
 eternal happiness, not from any works of my own, but through
 the infinite goodness of my most gracious God, and through
 the merits and intercession of our blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus
 Christ. I give to my dear Husband John Edmondson
 all the Land that I possess during his life. I also give him the Stocks
 of Horses Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, and furniture, for ever. The Bed
 my dear Mama worked I desire may be given to my Sister
 Sarah Harrison. I give to my dear Husband the following Negroes, Ned,
 Abraham, Charles & Pompey, Pelly, Jane, Aggy, Isaac, Beckey, Moses
 to dispose of as he may think proper, to my Brother Carter B. Harrison
 I give Henry, his Wife Betty and their Children for ever; to my
 Sister Sarah Harrison I give Pelly and three Children Molly, Tom
 and Patty. to my Brother Ben's son Ben I give Johnny, to my
 Brother William H. Harrison I give George, to William Rickman
 Coupland I give Joe, Sarah Daughter of Pelly I give to Betty
 Randolph Harrison, my Certificates that are in the hands of my Brother
 Ben: I desire may be giving to my Husband to dispose of
 as he may think proper. I lend to my Dear Husband during his
 Life my Negro Boy Isham at his Death to return to my Brother
 Ben's son, Benjamin Harrison, at W^c Edmondson's death my Will
 and desire is, that my Brother Carter should have the house and
 Land we now live on, containing by estimation Two hundred and
 Eighty Acres, and that my Brother William H. Harrison should have the
 Land, Dockter Rickman purchased of Tom Brown. I leave
 to my Sister Ann Coupland my Watch, I desire to be
 buried by W^c Rickman and that the place may be inclosed
 with a Brick Wall. This Will written with my own hand
 I sign and seal the third day of May 1790.

At a Court held for Charles City County at the Court House
on Thursday the twentieth day of January 1791.

The aforementioned last Will of Elizabeth Edmondson deceased was
proved to be written wholly by the Deceased by the Oaths of John
Dunlar and John Colgen and Ordered to be recorded. And on
the motion of John Edmondson who made Oath thereto according to law
and together with Carter B. Harrison his security entered into and
acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Two thousand pounds
conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for
obtaining letters of Administration on the estate of the said Elizabeth
with her said Will annexed in due form.
