and Judith Garthright all the Rent and Revenue of my Estate both real and Personal that
is to say Land and negroes and every other species of property that I may die possessed of to
be equally divided between them and their Heirs lawfully begotten of their bodies forever
except my Right in the Still that I give and bequeath unto Robert Binford to him
and his Heirs forever. Lastly I do appoint Robert Binford William Bates, and Giddings
Pollard Executors to this my last Will and Testament to see the same duly performed.
