First I recommend my soul, body, and spirit to almighty God; humbly beseeching him to be merciful to me, at hour of death and day of Judgment, and its my desire that my body may be decently committed to the earth by the directions of my Executors hereafter named, and as touching such worldly estate as god has been pleased to bless me with, I give and dispose of in manner following. First I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Richison Alliens one feather Bed, and furniture to her & her heirs forever. Item secondly I give and bequeath to the said Elizabeth R. Alliens one of my best Gowns to her and her heirs. Lastly I do nominate and appoint Stephen Davidson my whole and sole executor of this my last will, and testament, revoking and annulling all other Wills heretofore made by me, Witness my hands, and seal this thirteenth day of June, one thousand seven hundreds and ninety one.

At a monthly court held for Charles City County on Thursday the 19th day of December 1793 The afove written last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Parrish decd proved by the oath of John Hillard and continued for further proof, Stephen Davidson the executor therein named appeared in court and refused to take upon himself the execution thereof. And on the motion of William Parrish son: who made oath thereto according to law, and together with John Christian his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of fifty pounds with such condition as the law in this case directs, certificate is granted them for obtaining letters of administration with the Will annexed in due form.
