In the name of God amen I Frances Harris of the County of Charles City and Parish of Westover being far advanced in years but in perfect mind sound sense and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body knowing it is ordained for all persons once to die I do make and ordain

this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following Vyt
Item I give and bequeath unto my grand son George Hunt Harris, son of
Hoby Harris my bed and furniture one iron pot and pot hooks, which I
give to him and his heirs forever, but in case my said grandson should
chance to die before he arrives to lawful age or marries, I then desire that
the said property given him, to be equally divided amongst my son Chavis
Harris's children. -

Item I lend unto my son Chavis Harris for and during the lives of the said
Chavis and Susanna his wife all the residue of my estate (my wearing
apparel excepted) and at the death of my said son Chavis and Susanna
his wife I give the said property lent them to the child or children of the said
Chavis Harris to be equally divided amongst them.

Item I give unto my grand daughter Polly Harris one new ballico gown
Item I give to my daughter in law Susanna Harris (wife of Chavis Harris)
one muslin gown. - Item I give to my grand daughter Rebecca Brown
(daughter of John Brown) One spinning wheel and pair Cards and flatt
Iron. - It is my will and desire that my daughter Susanna Brown
wife of Dixon Brown should divide my wearing apparel and such other of
my household goods (not heretofore given) amongst herself and her daughters and
my grand daughter Beliza Harris and Rebecca Brown wife of Edmund Brown
to each in equal proportion as near as can be made, of the said wearing

appeared to as aforesaid. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son in Law
John Brown, Abraham Brown and ^{Charles City, Virginia Wills 1789-1808} ~~and~~ William Brown my whole and sole
