I, Rebecca H. Cooke, of Charles City County, Virginia, of perfect mind, and  
memory make this my last Will, and Testament in manner, and form following:  
Imprimis.—I give unto my grand-Daughter Elizabeth Bray Tyler,  
and her heirs forever, every part of my estate real, and personal. —

2<sup>d</sup>. It is my will, and desire that R. Locke Tyler may have, when she  
eighteen years old, Thirteen Negroes (the increase of those given by me) as  
near her age, as can be chosen. — It is also my wish, that if E. B. Tyler  
should die before R. Locke Tyler, she R. L. Tyler, and her Heirs, may have  
Westbury, as well as the Negroes, mentioned above, forever. —

I give my Godson Andrew Talbot twenty five pounds, which  
he is to receive after my decease.

10thly If it can be conveniently done, I wish to be laid along side, or  
rather near the remains of Mr. Locke, without parade or expence —  
Lastly. I do appoint Executor, & Executrix to this my last Will and  
Testament, Charles Tyler, & Elizabeth Tyler of Charles City, as witness my hand, this tenth day  
of May. One thousand seven hundred and ninety two.
