Item I give and bequeath unto Sons Hamlin, Littleberry, Mayo, John and Thomas Willcox all the estate of whatsoever kind which was devised to me by my son Edward Willcox died to be equally divided between and their heirs forever.

Item all the estate of every kind, which I shall die possessed of or entitled to (except what I shall hereafter dispose of) I give and bequeath unto sons Littleberry, Mayo, John and Thomas Willcox and Edward Willcox son of my son Hamlin Willcox to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Nancy Harwood one Bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. And lastly I appoint my sons Hamlin and Mayo Willcox the Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In witness my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of July 1799.
