and memory. I praise Almighty God for it, do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following
that is to say. First and principally I commend my Soul and Body
into the hands of Almighty God, hoping through the merits Death
and Passion of Jesus Christ, my Saviour, to have full and free pardon
and Forgiveness for all my sins and to inherit eternal Life. I desire
my Body to be devoutly buried at the Discretion of my Executors
hereafter named, and as touching the disposition of all such
temporal estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me,
I give and dispose of in manner as follows. — First I will that all
my just debts and Funeral charges shall be paid. — Item I give
unto my Grandson James Jordan Bullivant Son of John Bullivant
and Sarah his wife Fifty Acres of land more or less near adjoining the
Meadows, to him and his heirs for ever. — Item I give unto
my Nephew Edward Bullivant Son of Mary Bullivant One
Sorell-mare called Blaze with my Riding Saddle and Bridle
to him and his heirs for ever — All the rest of my estate I desire
may be sold and the money to be equally divided between my two
