In the name of the Lord I James Bradley of the County of Charles City and parish of Western being unwell and knowing that I must shortly put off this body of flesh being in possession of my reason do in the first place commit my body to the earth to be interred at the direction of my friends my soul to God from whence it first derived its existence believing he is able to keep that which I have committed to his care twenty seven years past. I do secondly dispose of my estate as follows, I will in the first place that all my just debts be paid, secondly that the following named negroes be sold for cash and the money applied for the benefit of my estate to m^{rs}, Betty, Charles and Lewis. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Betsey B Bradley all my land with all the appertinances thereto belonging, likewise one half of my personal estate after my debts are paid to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to Robert Jackson that now lives with me forty pounds for the purpose of educating him. All the residue of my estate I give and bequeath to my grand sons to wit; Robert and Mitchell Bradley to them and their heirs forever to be equally divided between them and that their mother Susanna Bradley should have a reasonable support from the income of Robert and Mitchell Bradleys share of my estate as long as she lives a widow. I will farther that my sister Mourning Bradley have ten pounds a year as long as she lives single, out of the income of my daughters part of my estate and lastly I appoint my friend William Clopton and Robert Bradley my grand son my executor of this my last will and testament revoking and disannulling all other wills by me made heretofore, as witness my hand and seal this seventeenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and three.

And on the motion of the said Clopton who made oath as the law directs, and entered into bond with Henry B Christian and Richard Graves his securities in the penalty of thirteen thousand dollars conditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form. Liberty reserved the other executor to join in the probat when he may think fit.
