*James Harris's Will*

In the name of God Amen. I James Harris of Charles City County  
in the parish of Westover being very sick and weak of body, but of  
perfect and sound mind and memory doth to God for it, do make  
and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form  
following. First. I bequeath my soul to God who gave it firmly hoping  
the forgiveness of all my sins to and by the merits of my blessed Saviour  
and my body to the ground to be decently interred at the discretion  
of my executors hereafter named. Inasmuch, my will and desire is,  
that my stock of Sheep shall be sold, and that my depending Sheep  
be delivered into the possession of Abraham Brown. Item, my desire  
is that after all my just debts and funeral charges are paid, that all the  
rest of my estate be equally divided amongst all my children, but my  
son John excepted. And lastly I do constitute and appoint Abraham  
Brown my whole and sole executor of this my last Will and Testament  
lively revoking and making void all former Wills by me heretofore  
made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
my seal this twenty ninth day of July One thousand seven hundred  
and eighty four.

at the Courthouse on Saturday the twenty first day of May 1791.

The aforeswitten last Will and Testament of James Harris  
deceased was proved by the oath of Dixon Brown one of the witnesses thereto  
and Ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of James Harris who  
made oath according to law and together with Major Willcox his  
security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of  
Fifty pounds conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted  
him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the  
said James Harris deceased with his Will annexed in due  
form.
