I James Ladd of Charles City County knowing the uncertainty of time in this World, and in order to settle my outward affairs so as to pursue disputes after my decease and to do justice to my wife and children in the distribution of what Goods & Estate kind Providence has been pleased to bestow upon me, as in Sound Mind and memory, make and ordain this present writing to be my last Will and Testament; revoking all other Wills hitherto by me made. Imp^o. I Give and bequeath to my loving wife Isabelle Ladd one half my Household and Kitchen Furniture, also one half of my Stock, of Horses, Cattle, Sheep and Hogs and my four wheel riding carriage to her, and her Heirs forever I also lend to my loving wife the use of one half of the Land and premises whereon I now live supposed to be Six hundred Acres also one fourth part of Cane Mills for support of herself, four Daughters Isabelle during my said Wifes natural and my said Daughters single life. Then I give and bequeath to my Son James Dawson Ladd the Land Buildings that Granville except one Room of the Lumber House on the lower floor which Room I give to my Son Benjamin Whitehead Ladd I also give to my said Son James Ladd four hundred pounds to be deducted out of the principle I owe him or owing me, I also Give him up the Interest on all the money he owes me to the end of three years from this time and that time to pay the balance of the Principle I owe due from him to me to him his Heirs and assigns forever. Then I Give to my Son Joseph Ladd the Land and Plantations whereon William Bradley now lives the Land called Lewis and that called Coleys (the last mentioned he has a Debt for) and sixty Pound he received of Charles Bates also twenty pound I paid Doctor Christian and twenty pound cash; also one Feather, bed and furniture one cow half and all the profits made in the Shoe and Basket making business known by the name of Joseph Ladd to him and his Heirs and assigns forever. Then I Give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin W Ladd one half of the Land and premises whereon I now live containing by estimation Six hundred Acres also the other half of the same after his Mothers decease also one fourth part of Cane Mills and the other fourth part after his Mothers death and one half of the Hogs at the Mill, one feather, Bed and furniture one cow and half one share in the James River Canal now due to him and twenty five pounds cash, to him and his Heirs and assigns forever, and in case of his Mothers death before his Sister Isabelle's Marriage he is hereby enjoined to give her, her Board free of expence provided she chooses to live with him. Then I Give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Harris one hundred pound besides what she has already received to her and her Heirs forever. Then I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Bates one Hundred pound besides what she has already received to her and her Heirs forever. I also give up to my Son in Law James Bates the debt due from him to me upon the conditions of his purchasing it giving to his wife (my said Daughter Ann) one good

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Copper Hitter to her then hers forever, Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter
Isabelle Ladd my one third part of the Land and premises called Millers the
other two thirds wherof belongs to Robert Evans and James D Ladd containing
in the whole some hundred & forty Acres but in case my Executors hereafter named
Should think it would be to the advantage of my said Daughter to sell
the said one third share of that Tract of Land they are requested and hereby
impowered to do so and vest the proceeds in Bonds, Stocks, or any other public
funds which they may judge best and in such way that it may be under
the complete control of my said Daughter Isabelle when she may arrive
to Lawful age. I also Give her one Horse saddle & furniture one Feather
Bed & furniture one bow & half and one hundred pounds to her and her
heirs & assigns forever. Item I Give and bequeath to my two Grandsons
Thomas S Pleasants and Joseph J Pleasants Fifty pounds each to
them, and there heirs & assigns forever; my Will and desire is that all the
rest and residue of my Estate of what nature and kind soever may after the

Ladd over the four hundred pounds given him in the Will but the Balance remains unjustified therefore must be omitted here, there is some Bonds, Notes, acc^t H^e amassing the Papers of Peter Christian H^e which were supposed by the commissioners at the Settlement of Thos^d concern to be worth nothing and as they were not endorsed by them I have not noticed them individually here there are many of you assign^d Standing on the Ledger of James Ladd Wm as they are unsettled and the Book will always show for itself is thought unnecessary to include them in this Inventory
