Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Roach one Shilling Sterling to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Roach one Shilling Sterling to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Gedion Roach One Shilling Sterling to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Susannah Roach one Shilling Sterling to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Peter Roach one Shilling Sterling to him and his heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Roach one Shilling
 Sterling to her and her heirs for ever — I give and bequeath to
 my son James Roach one Shilling Sterling to him and his heirs for ever. —
 I then I leave all the remainder of my estate after paying the above
 Legacies of Shilling Sterling to each of the above named Children to my
 beloved wife Mary Ann Roach during her widowhood to living both
 real and personal including all my houses Land and Stock &
 every property I may have at my death and at her Marriage or
 death my Will and desire is that (that) all my estate both real and
 personal including as above that is including all my houses Land Stock &
 every other of my property be equally divided between my six young Children
 Littleton Roach, Daniel Roach, John Roach, Luke Roach, Mordecai
 Roach, & Joshua Roach to be to them and their heirs for ever lastly I
 do ordain and leave William Barnes my executor and Mary Ann Roach
 my executrix of this my last Will and Testament Given under my
 hand and seal this Twentieth day of January 1879
