Will

In the name of God amen I James Southall of the County of Charles City and Parish of Westover being sick and weak, but of perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life and that all men must yield to death, when it pleaseth the great disposer of all things to call, do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner Viz^t First I recommend my soul to god who gave it me, and hope for a joyful

of all my sons through the merits of a Crucified saviour and as far as my
 worldly goods are has pleased almighty god to lend me I give and bequeath
 in the manner following — I give and bequeath to my eldest Daughter
 Sarah T. Southall all my right and title in that tract of Land lent by John
 Dudley to his sister Sarah wife of William Southall during her life, and then
 devised to Sarah T. Southall to her and her heirs forever. — I give ^{to my Daughter} and bequeath
 Margaret Harwood Southall five hundred pound Current money. — I give and
 bequeath to my daughter Ann Bolling Southall five hundred pounds current
 money — I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Harwood Southall
 my tract of Land whereon I now live known by the name of Milton to
 her and her heirs forever — I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann
 Bolling Southall my plantation which I purchased of William Vaughan &
 generally known by the name of Vaughans containing two hundred and
 twenty five Acres to the same more or less, to her and her heirs forever —
 My will and desire is that all my negroes of what kind soever be equally
 divided between my two daughters Sarah T. Southall and Elizabeth C. Willson after
 making good any deficiency that may happen in the payment of my Just debts
 and Legacies from my personal estate to them and their heirs forever —
 Whereas I have acted as guardian for my two eldest daughters Sarah T. Southall
 and Elizabeth C. Willson and have hired out their negroes devised to them by
 their Uncle John Dudley, but as a considerable part of them consisted of Women
 and Children and a subsistence of them was nearly as much as those that would
 hire, would command and having layed out the small surplus on their
 education which has impowered me to give them a better one than I otherwise
 could have done, in consequence of which should they or either of them recover
 any thing hereafter from my Executors on account of my Guardianship in that
 case my will and desire is that the amount so recovered be deducted from
 what I have before bequeathed to them recovering the same. — My Will and
 desire is that all the residue of my estate of whatsoever nature or kind
 be equally divided between my two youngest daughters Margaret Harwood
 Southall and Ann Bolling Southall to them and their heirs forever —
 My will and desire is that my brother John Southall act as guardian for
 my two youngest daughters Margaret Harwood Southall and Ann Bolling Southall.

Lastly I nominate, constitute and appoint my loving brothers John Southall and William Southall, and my son in law John Willson executors to this my last Will, whereunto I have set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of March one thousand seven hundred and ninety four.

John Willson one of the Executors named in the said will appeared in Court & refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof, and on the oaths of John Southall and William Southall the other executors named in the said Will and making oaths thereto according to law, and together with John Belgin and John Edmondson their securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of four thousand pounds with such condition as the law in this case directs, Certificate is granted them ^{for} Attaining apostate thereof in due form.
