and memory. I praise Almighty God for it, do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following
that is to say, First and principally, I commend my Soul and Body

and Passion of Jesus Christ my Saviour, to have full and free pardon
and Forgiveness for all my sins and to inherit eternal Life. I desire
my Body to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors
hereafter named, and as touching the disposition of all such
temporal estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me,
I give and dispose of in manner as follows. First I will that all
my just debts and Funeral charges shall be paid. Item, I give
unto my Grandson James Gordon Bullivant Son of John Bullivant
and Sarah his wife Fifty Acres of Land more or less near adjoining the
Meadows to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give unto
my Nephew Edward Bullivant Son of Mary Bullivant One

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to him and his heirs for ever - All the rest of my estate I desire

my Friends Wiltram Parrish and John Holdsworth Executors to

this my last Will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke
disannul and make void all former Wills and Testaments by

me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my

hand and seal This Third day of October One thousand seven

hundred and ninety.

probate thereof in due form.
