be to almighty God for the same do make and ordain this Writing my last will and
Testament in manner and form following to Wit. Imprimis My Will and desire
is that as much of my stock of Cattle & Hogs to sold as will pay my Funeral Expenses
and just Dells. Item I leave all the residue of my Estate of every kind to my loving
Wife Elizabeth Hogg During her Widowhood for the support of herself and Children
and at the expiration of which desire is that whatever remains as well Land
as other property be Equally Divided among my Children Rebecca Hogg, Elizabeth
Hogg & Mary Hogg them and their heirs forever. And lastly I constitute and appoint
my Friend James Walker my Executor to this my last Will and Testament In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 30th day of
September 1801

Wife Elizabeth Hogg During her ^{life} for the support of herself and Children
and at the expiration of which desire is that whatever remains as well Land
as other property be Equally Divided among my Children Rebecca Hogg, Elizabeth
Hogg & Mary Hogg them and their heirs forever. And lastly I constitute and appoint
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Elizabeth Hogg Widow of the said Jepp Hogg who made oath as the law directs Certificate is
granted her for obtaining Letters of Administration with the will annexed in due form and
thereupon the said Elizabeth Hogg together with Braxton Harrison her security entered into
and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred Dollars conditioned
according to Law.
