 the other part. My will and desire is that my daughter Sarah Edwards
 shall have choice of my feather beds and one bed, then the residue of my
 estate to be equally divided between my three children William Edwards
 Sarah Edwards and James Edwards. I leave my loving wife my whole
 and sole executor of this my last will and testament As witness my
 hand and seal the thirteenth day of December One thousand eight
 hundred and five
