 be to almighty God for the same do make and ordain this Writing my last will and
 Testament in Manner and form following to Wit. Impresing My Will and desire
 is that as much of my stock of cattle & Hogs be sold as will pay my Funeral Expenses
 and just Debts Here I bind all the residue of my Estate of every kind to my loving
 Wife Elizabeth Hogg During her Widowhood for the support of herself and Children
 and at the expiration of which time that whatever remains as well Land —
 as other property be Equally Divided among my Children Rebecca Hogg, Elizabeth
 Hogg & Henry Hogg them and their heirs forever. And lastly I constitute and appoint
 my Friend James Walker my Executor to this my last Will and Testament In
 Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 30th day of
 September 1801

 in named who refused to qualify, and being proved by Elizabeth Brown
 and Royle Jackson the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of
 Elizabeth Hogg widow of the said Isaac Hogg who made oath as the law directs Certificate is
 granted her for obtaining letters of Administration with the will annexed in due form and
 thereupon the said Elizabeth Hogg together with Braxton Harrison her security entered into
 and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred Dollars conditioned
 according to Law.
