do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and
form as followeth Viz^t Item I give and bequeath to my
Daughter Elizabeth Hargrave one feather bed and furniture
which she hath in her possession one side saddle which used to be
called mine also six silver tea spoons to her and her heirs for ever
Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Sedbetter one feather bed
and furniture one philley come of the mare known by the name of
fancy also two silver spoons one a table Spoon and one tea ditto one
side saddle to her and her heirs for ever Item I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Martha Charles one feather bed and
furniture one mare and colt known by the name of the young mare
and Sixty Pounds cash to her and her heirs for ever Item I give and
bequeath to my Five Grandchildren Thomas ^{Anne} Hargrave Henry Isaac
and Jacob Sedbetter Fifty Pounds cash to be equally divided between
them to them and their heirs for ever Item I jointly give to my
two Daughters Mary Sedbetter and Martha Charles fifty Barrels of
Corn Twelve Bushels of wheat and ten choice hogs to them
and their heirs for ever

and after my debts and legges are paid off if there should be any
 thing remaining I leave the use of it to be my two daughters Mary Sed-
 -den and Martha Charles as long as they remain unmarried to be
 equally divided between them and at their death or marriage their
 part of the things lent to be Equally divided between all my Chil-
