At a quarterly Court, held for Charles City County, on Thursday, the 16th day of May, 1793. — The afore written last Will, and Testament of Rebecca H. Locke was proved by the oaths of Benjamin Mountcastle, and Robert Mountcastle, two of the witnesses thereto. And at a monthly Court held for the County aforesaid, the 18th day of July, in ^{the} year last mentioned, ^{the said will} was proved by the oath of Francis Mountcastle, the other witness thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Samuel Tyler, the executor therein named, who made oath thereto, according to law, and together with John Tyler his security, entered into, and acknowledged their bond, in the penalty of Ten thousand pounds with such condition as the law directs. Testified is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form. Liberty is reserved for the executors therein named to join in the probate, as they shall think fit.

Mary Davidson's Will — in perfect sense, and memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life, and that it is appointed for all persons once to die, First of all, I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God, who gave it to me, and my body to be interred in christian-like manner by my Executors, hereafter mentioned, and, ^{to} what worldly estate it hath been pleased god to bless me with, I give and bequeath in manner, and form following

Imprimis First of all, my will, and desire is that all my Just debts be paid. — Item My will further is, that all my estate, be it of what kind soever should be sold, and the money, arising from the sale of the said estate, should be equally divided between all my children, to wit: Mary Major, William, & Elizabeth Davidsons, to them, and their Heirs forever; but in case either of my aforesaid children should die, before they come of the age of twenty one years, or Issue, that their part or parts should be equally divided between the survivors, to them, and their Heirs forever.

And lastly, I constitute my good friends, Furness Southall, and Henry Holman, Southall my whole, and sole Executors of this my last will, & Testament, revoking and disannulling all other Wills, heretofore made by me. In Witness my hand I seal this third day of December One thousand seven hundred and ninety. —

thereto and ordered to be recorded.

December 8th 1789. In the name of God, ^{James Littleberry Perry} of Charles City County, of sound mind, and memory, do constitute, and
appoint this my last Will, and Testament, in manner and form as follows
Viz^t. First, I recommend my soul to god who gave it, and my body to
be buried in a christian like manner, and then I proceed to dispose
of my worldly goods, as it hath pleased god to bless me with.
Item. My will, and desire is, that all my Just debts be first paid.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my son William Perry my Land I now live
on, to him, and his Heirs, forever, lawfully begotten, but, if he should die
before he arrives to the age of Twenty one years, in that case I give the
said Land to my daughter, Sally Perry, to her, and her Heirs, forever, law-
fully begotten.

Item. My will, and desire is, that all the residue of my estate whatsoever
be equally divided between my daughters Priscilla Perry, Lucy Perry, &
Sally Perry, to them, and their Heirs, ^{lawfully} begotten, but, if it should
be the case, that my son William should die, before he arrives to the age
of Twenty one years, and my daughter Sally should be alive, to Her with
Land, my will and desire is, that she should not come in for any
part of my estate, given to my three daughters, but that it should
be equally divided between my other two daughters Priscilla & Lucy.
Lastly I constitute and appoint William Southall my whole, and sole
Executor.
