being sick and weak of body, but of perfect mind and memory, and knowing the  
mortality of my Body, and that it is appointed for all men to Once to die, do  
make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, in manner following to  
wit: I give my soul to God that gave it me, and to the Earth from whence it came  
to be buried in a Christianlike manner: And as touching my worldly goods  
that it has pleased Almighty God to bestow me with, I give in manner and form  
following, that is to say, first I stand unto my loving wife Sarah Charles all  
my Estate both Real and Personal during her life, or widowhood, and at the  
Death or marriage of my wife, my Will and desire is, that my son Edmond  
Charles shall have all my Lands and my Negro Boy known by the of  
Emanuel to him and his heirs forever and at the marriage of my wife my

3) desire is that my daughter Mary Charles shall have my Negro Girl named  
Nell to her and her heirs forever. And my Will and desire is that at the  
death or marriage of my wife Sarah Charles that all the residue of my  
estate not already willed away shall be equally divided between my Two  
Daughters Elizabeth Hylland, Sarah Charles, Lucy Charles and Mary Charles  
to them and their heirs forever. My Will and desire that my Two daughters  
Sarah Charles and Mary Charles shall have a right to a House and Home  
as long as they live single and not to be interrupted. my desire is that I  
give my son William Charles One Shilling Sterling, my Will and desire  
is that I give five pounds to my son William Charles child by the  
name of Phillip Charles, but if this said Phillip Charles shall die  
before he comes to the years of Twenty One or Marriage that the money above  
mentioned should return back to the surviving children again: And I do  
hereby constitute and appoint my living wife Sarah Charles Executrix and my  
son Edmund Charles Executor to this my last Will and Testament, renouncing  
all others. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal this Twenty  
Ninth day of January, One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety Two.

the Twentyfifth day of June 1792.

The aforeswitten last Will and Testament, was proved by the Oaths of Joseph  
Mountcastle and Robert Murrell Two of the Witnesses thereto, and ordered  
to be recorded: And Sarah Charles an Executrix herein named came  
into Court and relinquished her right of Executresship in favor of Henry  
Duke; and on the motion of the said Duke, who together with John  
Belger and John Timberlake <sup>his securities</sup>, entered into and acknowledged their Bond  
in the penalty of one hundred pounds conditioned as the Law directs, certifying  
obtaining Letters of administration with the will annexed is granted him in due  
form: Liberty being reserved for the other Executor therein named to qualify.
