Next, I give and bequeath to my Son William Drake one feather Bed and furniture, which he has in his possession to him and his heirs forever. Next, I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert Drake two thirds of all my Lands I am possessed of, to take place immediately; and the other one third of my Lands at my loving
