 and her heirs forever, every part of my estate real, and personal. —

2^d It is my will, and desire that R. Locke Tyler may have, when she
 is eighteen years old, Thirteen Negroes (the increase of those given by me) as
 near her age, as can be chosen. — It is also my wish, that if E. B. Tyler
 should die before R. Locke Tyler, she R. L. Tyler, and her Heirs, may have
 Westbury, as well as the Negroes, mentioned above, forever. —

3^d I give my Godson Andrew Talbot twenty five pounds, which
 he is to receive after my decease. —

4^d If it can be conveniently done, I wish to be laid along side, or
 rather near the remains of Mr. Locke, without parade or expence —

5^d Lastly, I do appoint Executor, & Executrix to this my last Will and
 Testament, Elizabeth Tyler of Charles City, as witness my hand, this tenth day
 of May, One thousand seven hundred and ninety two. —

At a quarterly court, held for Charles City County, on Thursday, the 16th day of May, 1793. — His afore written last Will, and Testament of Rebecca H. Locke was proved by the oaths of Benjamin Mountcastle, and Robert Mountcastle, two of the witnesses thereto. And at a monthly Court held for the County aforesaid, the 18th day of July, in ^{the} year last mentioned, the said will, was proved by the oath of Francis Mountcastle, the other witness thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Samuel Tyler, the executor therein named, who made oath thereto, according to law, and together with John Tyler his security, entered into, and acknowledged their bond, in the penalty of Two thousand pounds with such condition as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat. thereof in due form. Liberty is reserved for the executors named to join in the probate, as shall think fit. — Teste. Tracy Boyd C.C.

Will — In the name of ^{God} amen, I Mary Davidson of Charles City County
in perfect sense, and memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of this
life, and that it is appointed for all persons once to die, First of all,
I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God, who gave it to
me, and my body to be interred in Christian-like manner by my
Executors, hereafter mentioned, and to what worldly estate it hath been
pleased god to bless me with, I give and bequeath in manner, and form following

Imprimis. First of all, my will, and desire is that all my just debts
be paid. — Item. My will further is, that all my estate, be it of what
kind soever should be sold, and the money, arising from the sale of the
said estate, should be equally divided between all my children, to wit:
Mary Major, William, & Elizabeth Davidson, to them, and their Heirs forever;
but in case either of my aforesaid children should die, before they come
of the age of twenty one years, or issue, that their part or parts should
be equally divided between the survivors, to them, and their Heirs forever.
And lastly, I constitute my good friends, Fannie Southall, and Henry Coleman,
Southall my whole, and sole Executors of this my last will, & testament, revoking
and disannulling all other Wills, heretofore made by me. In witness my hand
& seal this third day of December One thousand seven hundred and ninety. —
