Item I give and bequeath unto my son David Cary, that part of my land on the north side of the road leading from the east run to James Ladd's and on the north side of the path called Hubbard's path, I give to my said Son and to his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my daughter Frances Cary ten pounds to her the heirs forever; Item I give and bequeath all the remainder of my land wherein I now dwell to my grand son Robert Cary son of David Cary to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my grand daughter Elizabeth Cary daughter of David Cary one cow called molly and three barrels of corn for sundry services done me to her and her heirs forever

Item I give to my above named grand son Robert Cary three barrels of corn for sundry services done me

Item I leave the remainder of my personal estate to be sold by my Executor hereafter named of whatever kind it may be to pay all my just debts and legacies and the remainder of the money arising from said sales to be equally divided amongst all my surviving children except David Cary and Frances Cary to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly I do constitute and appoint my friend Joseph Ladd Executor to this my last will and Testament unto my hand this twentieth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred

Ladd his securities in the penalty of four hundred dollars conditioned according to law, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form.
