and Memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of continuing here, and being desirous  
to settle my outward affairs as well as I can, do make and ordain this my last Will and  
Testament in manner following to wit, I leave to my loving wife Rachel Drake, one  
third of my Land and Plantation during her natural life, also one half of all my  
Personal Estate during her natural life or widowhood which may first happen and  
no longer. Item, I give and bequeath to my son William Drake one feather Bed and  
furniture, which he has in his possession to him and his heirs forever. Item, I give  
and bequeath unto my son Robert Drake two thirds of all my Lands I am possessed  
of, to take place immediately; and the other one third of my Lands at my loving

Wife's room, also one Bed and one Desk, to her and her Husb and a Spigons forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Charles one feather bed and furniture which she hath in her possession taken and her Husb forever. Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Drake one feather bed and furniture, called her bed, to her and her husr and a Spigons forever. Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rachel Drake one feather bed and furniture, called her bed, to her and her Husb and a Spigons forever.

And it is my will and desire, that my two Daughters Elizabeth and Rachel Drake may have the full use of my dwelling House, the end and stony, upstairs, so long as they and either of them live single and no longer. Item, I give and bequeath to my Son William Drake and my Daughter Sarah Charles children, Deborah French Charles, Rachel Eliza Drake, Charles and Sarah South Charles for to associate them, also to Elizabeth Drake and Rachel Drake all the Possessions and Revenue of my Estate at my decease and at my living Wifes decease, to be equally divided amongst them in four shares to them and their Husb and a Spigons forever, my will and desire is that my estate may not be appraised.

Lastly, I do constitute and appoint my Son Robert Drake my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, the twenty fifth day of May One Thousand Eight Hundred and one.
