In the name of God Amen I Robert Fry of the County of Charles City and Parish of Westover being sick and weak but of perfect mind and Memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life and that all men must yield to Death when it pleaseth the great disposor of all things to call, do Make this to be my last will and Testament in Manner Viz first I recommend my soul to God who gave it me and hope for a forgiveness of all my sins through the merits of a crucified saviour and as for my worldly goods as it has pleased Almighty God to send me I give and bequeath in the manner following to wit - Item my will and desire is that all my just Debts be paid - Item I give unto my loving Wife Elizabeth Fry all my Estate both real and personal to her to dispose of as she may think proper lastly I constitute and appoint my aforesaid Wife Elizabeth Executrix of this my last will and Testament without her being obliged to give security for her Executrix ships revoking all others heretofore made in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventh day

of October one thousand eight hundred and one.
