 desire is that my estate be divided into three parts my wife to have
 one third during her natural life, and the other two thirds to my child
 Mary Burton and her heirs forever as also the part I lend my wife
 after her death. Provided my child should die before she comes of age
 or marries I give to my friend John Rean a negro woman named
 Betty and her increase to him and his heirs forever, and lastly I
 constitute and appoint my wife executrix and my friend George W H
 Kinge executor to this my last will and testament, as witness my
 hand and seal this eighth day of October one thousand eight hundred
 and five.

 courthouse on Thursday the 21st day of November 1805.

The aforementioned last will and testament of Ralph Burton deceased
 was presented in court by George W H Kinge the executor therein named
 and being proved by the oaths of James Mathew and John Saml two of
 the witnesses thereto was ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the
 said executor who made oath thereto according to law and together with
 John Kinge his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the
 penalty of Ten thousand dollars with such condition as the laws directs
 certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form
 liberty reserved the executor to join in the probat when she may
 think fit

 with pig and five young hogs which property at the decease of my
 wife I give and bequeath to my son George to him and his heirs
 forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha one
 negro girl named Delila and one bed and furniture to her and
 her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Edwad one
 negro girl named Judea one feather bed and furniture, and my
