First I commit my soul to God who gave it, and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereinafter named. In witness my will and desire is that all my just debts be first paid and then that my sister Sue Ann
Hawthorne may have so much of my estate annually as may keep her from want at the discretion of my Executor during her natural life and at her decease the remainder of my estate if any be equally divided among the surviving heirs of my sister Lucy Roper deceased to them and their heirs and assigns forever. Lastly I do hereby appoint my friend William Bledsoe my whole and sole executor, revoking all former wills and testaments heretofore made by me. As witness my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of May one thousand eight hundred and four.

In the name of God amen I Thomas Ballard of the County of Charles City and parish
of Western being in of weakly state, of bodily health but in perfect sense and memory, thanks
be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is ordained for all men once to die,
I do make and ordain this my last will and testament, my soul I recommend unto the hands of Almighty God
who gave it, in hopes of a glorious resurrection and as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless
me with, I dispose of as follows: to wit. First I desire that my just debts shall be paid from my estate in the first
instance. Next I desire that the family burying place now on my land, shall remain sacred and free for the
interment of the family and their posterity that is to say a sufficient ground for that purpose, and for so further
disposition I do through the help and duty I owe to my ancestors and family and hope the same may be
remembered by those who may consider it. Next I give and bequeath unto my brother John Ballard all my lands
in Charles City County it being where I now live or elsewhere, on which the said John Ballard paying unto my brother
Francis D Ballard one third of the value of the said lands which valuation may be by their mutual consent
or by men appointed by them for that purpose, on compliance on the part of the said John Ballard at the said
lands I give unto him and his heirs forever. Next having an old negro man slave named George who has been a faithful
servant I desire and hereby give him the said negro slave his freedom after my death in a perfect and full enjoyment
of liberation and as far as full and perfect manhood as any law could authorize me. Next all the balance of my
estate not hereby given or bequeathed I do hereby give request and desire shall be equally divided
between my three sisters to wit Elizabeth Fountain widow of Moses Fountain, Sarah Fountain wife of Abraham Fountain
and Lucy Eppes wife of Peter Eppes which I give and bequeath unto them and their heirs forever.
Lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my Brother John Ballard, my friend Myatt Walker
and John Smith my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and testament, renouncing Breveking
all Wills heretofore made by me. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this thirteenth day of August AD One thousand eight hundred and four.
