Thomas Murrell's Will.

In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Murrell of the County of Charles City, being sick and weak in body, but of perfect sense and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, to wit;

Impremis. I give and bequeath to my sister Martha Murrell the reversion of the House and Land willed to me by my Father Thomas Murrell at my Mother's death to her and her heirs for ever. *unum Item*. I give to my Brother Robert Murrell one Negro-man Dick who was willed to me after my Mother's death, by my Father to him and his heirs for ever. *unum Item*. I give to my Sister Sarah Moor the rest and residue of my estate arising, or amounting to my part of my Father's estate after my Mother's death. *unum Item*. I give and bequeath to my loving Mother Martha Murrell, One Bay Mare and Colt she has at present to her and her Heirs &c. *unum*

And lastly. I constitute my loving friend Joseph Vaiden Gent: executor of this my last will and Testament, and do hereby declare and pronounce, this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witnes's whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Twentysfourth day of October One thousand seven hundred and ninety.
