

In the name of God Amen I William Austin of the County of Charles City and Parish of Westover being sick of body but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be to almighty god for the same, do make and ordain this writing to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit: - Item I bequeath to my loving wife Nancy Austin the use of the Land and plantation I now live on, one negro girl named Nanny, one dark boy Marv, two choice cattle, five Barrows, one sow and eight sheats, her choice half of my born and Meat and all the fat in the house, two feather beds and furniture, and all my Chaises except the leather bottom ones, all my Tables, my basks, one harrow, and harrups during her natural life for the support and education of my children, and the use the two negro women I have hired during the present year, and at her death to be sold and the money to be equally divided between all my children. - Item my will and desire is that all the residue of my estate be sold for the payment of my Just debts, and should the money arising from such sale with my outstanding debts not be sufficient that my wife should have the liberty of pointing any part of what I have lent her to be sold till the debts are paid. - And Lastly I constitute and appoint my friends James Walker and John Ballard my Executors to this my last will and testament utterly revoking all others: And further my executors shall have power to make Edloe heirs or deeds to a certain tract of Land, on their giving a receipt in full of all demands against me. - Item I give to my wife half the crops of wheat that is now growing.

At a monthly court held for Charles City County on Thursday the 17th day of April 1794. The afore written last Will and Testament of William Austin decd was proved by the oaths of William Dancy and Agrop Austin two of the

interposes thereto and ordered to be recorded. James Walker one of the executors therein named appeared in court and refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof, and on the motion of John Ballard the other executor named in the said Will, and making oath thereto according to law, and together with William Ballard and Thomas Ballard his securities entered into and acknowledge their bond in the penalty of three hundred pounds with such condition as the law in that case directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form —

First I recommend my soul to God, and my body to be decently buried by my executors, as to my worldly goods with which it has pleased God to possess me, I give and bequeath as follows to wit. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Cath Durfey the plantation whereon I now live, and the land lying on the same side of the road with the house, to her and her heirs forever, and all the residue of my estate I leave to be sold for the payment my debts and if any remains after the debts are paid to be equally divided amongst all my children. I make and appoint Robert Chandler and Edward Walker, executors to this my last will and testament.
