Wm R Drinkard of the County of Charles City being of perfect sound Mind and
Will memory do make, and ordain this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form as follows. Impremis I leave to my loving
Polly C Drinkard during her life all my Land my Stock of every
description, as also my household and kitchen furniture, plantation
tools &c. except what is hereafter left to Nancy B. Harwood & my Daughters
Betsey & Polly Beche Drinkard. I also lend her my Negro woman Bette
for the term aforesaid. Item My Negroes, John, Mincy and Chica
my Will and desire may be sold on twelve months credit & the amount
of said sale to be equally divided between my children William R.
Drinkard, George Drinkard Jos. Drinkard, John Drinkard, David
Drinkard, Agness Coatsney & Nancy Allen. Item I give to Nancy B.
Harwood a Choice boe and calf also a Sow and pigs of the manies
and when ever that period arrives. Item My Will is that the Estate

as well personal as Negro, which was devised to my wife by the Will of her former Husband, and which I am possessed in right of Marriage with her, may be lent her for her life, and after her death to be equally divided between my Children by her, and also a Negro Girl Patience. Item I give to my Daughter Betsy & Polly & a Bed and furniture to each if they come of age, or marry, untill which time my wife is to have use of them. Item My desire is that out of the interest arising from the moneys due me, my Children by Molly & Drinkard may be Schooled and if the interest is not sufficient, then the principal, or part thereof must be applied to that purpose. Lastly My will is that at the death of my wife my Land & also all my estate of every description not already devised may be sold at the Discretion of my Executor, and the amount of such Sale to be equally divided between all of my Children, and appoint my friend Hamlin Wilcox, executor to this my last will and testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal Dec^r 29th 1804.
