In the name of God Amen. I William B. Harwood being of weak body, but of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit: Item I give to my beloved Wife Mary C. Harwood One half of my estate for ever, the other half I give to my Daughter Nancy B. Harwood for ever who is to be brought up by her Mother except she may think it necessary to chuse a Guardian when of age lawfully so to do if she dies before marriage or heirs of her Body her part to be supplied by my Wife for ever, but if my Wife and Child both die without heirs of their body then my whole estate to be divided among my Brothers and Sisters and their Representatives. Lastly I appoint my Wife and Major Withox Executors of this my Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this fourteenth day of January 1789.

Executrix therein named who made Oath thereto as the true directrix and
together with John Colquh her security sworn into and acknowledged their
bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds conditioned as the Law directs.

Liberty being reserved to the executor therein named to give in the
probate thereof when he shall think fit.

The aforementioned Inventory and appraisement of the estate of William B. Harwood deceased was this day returned and ordered to be Recorded.

Facts

In the name of God, Amen! I Sarah Brown of Charles City and Westover Parish being sick and weak of Body, but of perfect sense and memory thanks be unto God for the same, and being sensible of mortality do constitute and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner following, first I recommend my Soul Body and Spirit to Almighty God humbly beseeching him to be mindful to me at the Hour of Death and day of judgement and it is my desire that my Body may be decently committed to the Earth by the directions of my Exors hereafter named, and as touching such worldly estate as God has been pleased to bless me with I give and dispose of in manner following. First that all my just debts ~~be~~ be lawfully paid. Item I give and bequeath to my ^{son} Abraam Brown One Negro woman by the name of Abby to him and his heirs forever. Item I give also to my son Abraam Brown my bay Horse Colt to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son William Brown One Negro Girl Mary to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Youngest daughter Elizabeth Brown my best feather Bed, to her and her heirs forever. Item my Will and desire is that the remainder of my estate be equally divided among all my surviving Children to them and their heirs forever. And lastly I do nominate and appoint my friend James Parrott my whole and sole Exor. of this my last Will and Testament, Revoking and disannulling all other wills heretofore made by me. Witness my hand and seal this first day of June One Thousand seven Hundred and Ninety One. Signed sealed and published and delivered by me Sarah Brown to be my last Will and Testament.
