In the name of God Amen I Sarah H. Irby of the County of Charles City being weak in body but of sound mind, and disposing memory and wishing to dispose what worldly goods it has pleased God to entrust her doth therefore ordain this my last will and Testament in the manner following (that is to say) Item To my son Anthony H. Irby I leave my yoke of Oxen and the Ox cart a cow and six pigs to him and his heirs forever. Item My wish and desire is that my Daughter Rebecca Vaughan shall have five dollars Cash. Item, my wish is that my daughter Sarah H. Irby shall have one bed, to her and her heirs forever. Item To my daughter Mary H. Irby I leave one bed to her and her heirs forever. Item To my Daughter Elizabeth P. Irby I leave one Bed to her and her heirs forever. Item My desire is that my daughter Catharine I Irby shall have one bed and all the furniture to her and her heirs forever. My wish is that my youngest shall have first choice of beds. The remaining part of my estate to be sold and after paying my just debts the remainder equally divided among my Children above mentioned. I do lastly I nominate my son Anthony H. Irby Executor without security of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty one.
