In the name of God amen - I Anne B. Carter of Shirley in the County of Charles City, being of sound mind and disposing memory, but affected in bodily strength in such manner as to render all things in this life uncertain to me, do ordain this writing to be my last will and testament. I promise it is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid - Item, I give and bequeath to my son Williams the whole amount of his debt to me on account of his proportion of the Marriage Settlement due from the estate of my deceased Husband - Item, I give and bequeath to my six children, my Ann H. Lee, Catharine S. Berkeley, Bernard M. Williams, Lucy Burwell, and William Fibbyngale, equally to be divided between them, to them and their heirs forever, all my estate whether in money Bank stock, bonds, or debts due, and which may be due - and whereas the circumstances of the Husband of my said daughter Anne H. Lee are such as to make it desirable that the above bequest in her behalf, be secured exclusively to her use, it is therefore my will and desire that the said bequest to her my said Daughter, be held by my above named Son, Bernard M. for the use of her my said Daughter, free from the let. hindrance, molestation, or claim of the said husband of her my said Daughter - Item, I give and bequeath to my above named daughter Lucy Burwell, to her and her heirs forever, my carriage, carriage harness, and pair of Bay horses - Item, 'tis my will and desire that application shall not be made by my executors for the payment of any money which may be due me by my sister Lucy Shying - but that she shall receive the sum of two hundred dollars from the general fund of my estate - with this, I commend my soul to almighty God, and hereunto affix my hand and seal, this twenty ninth day of March in the year 1809.

Carter with a bodice thereto was this day presented in Court by Williams Carter one of the executors therein named, was proved by Alexander Sims one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and is truly recorded and on the motion of the said executor who made oath as the law directs, and entered into bond with James Christian and Patrick Hendren his securities in the penalty of twenty thousand Dollars, conditioned according to law, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form, liberty reserved the other executor to join in the probat when he may think fit.
