Item Believing that my estate has been greatly affected if not entirely soothed
by the care and attention of my brother who acts as executor to my husband
my desire is that his accounts as executor of my husband may be returned
to Court in the manner in which they stand on his books and that
they be not liable to any further investigation. -

Well knowing the salutary effects of religion and morality on the
habits and manners of every rational being I recommend with a
motherly affection these considerations to my dear niece C. B. Tyler
hoping that she will never forget the precious use of them in the
height of prosperity and success which God gave her an ample share
of and charity withheld which is above price. -

Lastly. - I nominate constitute and appoint my brother John
Tyler and his sons Nat and John Tyler my executors to this my
last will and testament my brother not to give any security
