In the name of God amen. I Ann Edloe of the County of Charles City being of sane mind and memory do make my will in the following manner to wit. I give and bequeath to my son John Edloe one negro labled namad Henry, to my grand son John W Edloe his choice of my negro boys, to my son John Edloe and my daughter Rebecca Edloe ^{I give} whatever money either of them may owe me, and the balance of my estate of whatever it may consist I desire may be equally divided between my son John Edloe and my daughter Rebecca Edloe, all the foregoing bequests I give to them and their heirs forever. - And lastly I nominate and appoint my son John Edloe executor and my daughter Rebecca Executrix to this my last will and testament revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made. -

In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal the sixth day of January eighteen hundred and nineteenth. -

At a Court held for Charles City County at the Court House the 18th day of February 1819. -

The aforesaid last Will and Testament of Ann Edloe decd was presented in Court and proved by the Oath of Myall Walker a witness to the same. - And at another Court held for the said County as aforesaid the 21st day of May following. The said Will was further proved by the Oath of Susan B Hill another witness to the same and Ordered to be recorded. - And on the motion of John Edloe the executor named in said Will who made Oath thereto according to Law and together with Mrs Walker and John S Stubblefield his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Ten thousand dollars dollars conditioned as the law directs, Certificate is granted the said John Edloe for obtaining a probat thereof in due form -

City State of Virga^a, do make & ordain this writing as if for my last will & Testament. - Whereas I am entitled to one half of the crops made secured, or to be secured from the plantation in this County called "The Level" the present year, of which said plantation Peter Demoville is at present manager & is to be benefitted by the other half: - and being indebted to my son Temple E Demoville as well in pecuniary considerations, as for his filial affection & attention do give and bequeath to my said son, Temple E, all my right, title and interest in & to the one moiety of the crops aforesaid or the money arising from such sales thereof; upon condition that my said son Temple E, pay the expences of physicians for attending me since I came from Richmond, & whilst I remain with him. -
