 of my friend and cousin Thomas Mayne Willing of Philadelphia, who has

 tea urn. - Item, whatever property I may have a right to dispose of, besides
 the above mentioned legacies I give equally to my three nieces Mary

 to have my common cloaths. -

At a Court held for Charles City County, at the Courthouse the 21st day of
 October 1812 The aforementioned last will and testament of Ann Willing Byrd
 decd was produced in Court, and there being no witnesses to the said will
 William Royster Elizabeth Royster and Nathaniel Nelson were sworn
 and severally deposed, that they are well acquainted with the testatrix's
 hand writing and verily believe the said will and the name there to subscribed
 to be wholly written by the testatrix own hand: Whereupon the said will as
 Ordered to be recorded. - And on the motion of Benjamin Harrison
 who made oath thereto according to law, and together with Richard W
 Byrd his security entered into and acknowledged aloud in the penalty
 of twelve thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, Certificate is
 granted the said Harrison for obtaining letters of administration on said
 decedent's estate with her will aforesaid annexed in due form
