In the name of God amen I Benjamin Bradley of Charles City being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory do make and Ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following Viz: Item after my just debts are paid I give and bequeath to my daughter Ellantha Winfree one negro girl Silvia one feather bed and furniture, one negro boy Harry, and one negro girl Annat, to her and the lawful heirs of her body. Item I leave to the benefit of my son Michael Bradley one negro boy George one girl Maria one feather bed and furniture; which property he is to have the use of until my grand-daughter Sally B Bradley shall arrive to the age of twenty one or marriage; and after either of said periods my will is that every article I lend him shall be equally divided between the lawful heirs of his body by his present wife to them and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Bradley one negro man Caleb, one negro girl Fanny, one negro boy Ned, one negro boy Jim one feather bed and furniture one young gray mare, one

cow

cow and calf to him and his heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath to my son Marsten Bradley one negro boy Jerry, one negro woman Jim one negro gal Nina, one negro man Jack, one old woman Jenny, one negro woman Chaney, and one feather bed and furnellure, one sorrel mare called Selah, and one bag Colt, and a cow and her increase given him by his grand mother, one man saddle, one gun, a large chest, one Calboard in the log house, to him and his heirs forever. Item, my negro man Isaac not yet bequeathed I leave to the whole of my children i.e: Patsy, Ulick, Benjamin and Marsten, to be hired or sold as they shall think most convenient for their benefit, and the profits arising from either hire or sale to be equally divided between my aforesaid children. - Item I give and bequeath to my two sons Benjamin and Marsten Bradley the tract of land I now live on to be divided as follows viz: Beginning at the corner of the house, my negro man Jack now lives in, running thence south through the Hickory level in such manner or direction as to make an equal division as to the number of acres, the part I now live on together with the improvements of every kind I give to my son Marsten Bradley, the unimproved moiety I give to my son Benjamin Bradley to them and their heirs forever. Item my will is that my negroes stock &c shall continue together the present year, at the close of which the manager is to be paid a reasonable sum for his services, after that my desire is the whole crop of every distinction shall be sold together with every species of stock, household furniture except what has been before mentioned, and the profits arising from said sale to be equally divided between my daughter Patsy Winfree and my son Ulick Bradley and the lawful heirs of their bodies in the manner as before mentioned. Lastly I leave my son, Benjamin Bradley and my son in law Ulick Winfree of Chesterfield Executors of this my last will and testament, revoking and making void all other wills heretofore made by me and confirming this to be my last.
