

Richmond 20th August 1790.

I am setting out tomorrow

morning for New-York, and in case of my death, this paper will be found in a sheet wholly written on, entitled, Richmond 15th Nov 1787 Codicil to my will &c. That paper is to be considered as my last will and Testament & this is Codicil to it. My two Negro Girls — Hebe & Phillis lately sent to Curles, Hebe to Sally Randolph, and Phillis to Polly Randolph, I give them and their increase to them and their heirs forever. I appoint my friend Capt Singleton one of my Executors, and I hope he will take on himself the Execution — that trust with any other executors.

At a monthly Court held for Charles City County at the Courthouse on Thursday the nineteenth day of December 1790.

The afore written last will and testament of Benⁿ Harrisonⁿ
decd with a codicil annexed, there being no witnesses to the same John
Christian and John Minge severally depone and saith that they were
well acquainted with the testators hand writing, and verily believe
that the said Will and the name subscribed are of the testators own wri-
ting, whereupon the said Will is ordered to be recorded, and Carter W.
Harrison one of the executors therein named refused to take upon himself
the burthen thereof, and on the motion of the said Executor, who made oath
as the Law directs, and together with John Minge and John Edmonds in
his securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty
of \$40,000, conditioned according to Law, certificate is granted him for
obtaining Letters of administration on the estate of Benⁿ Harrisonⁿ decd, -
and with his Will annexed in due form, liberty is given to Benⁿ Harrison
the other executor therein named to join in the probat when he shall think
fit.
