 earthly goods it has pleased God to bless me with, to that end do make and ordain this my last  
 will and testament revoking all others - that is to say - Item, I leave to my wife Sarah Irby all  
 my estate during her widowhood for the purpose of raising my children, consisting of Negroes  
 houses, cattle, and hogs, together with crops and plantation utensils of every description - Item,  
 My will and desire is that after the death or marriage of my wife Sarah Irby that my estate  
 be equally divided among all my children share and share alike - Item my will and desire  
 is that there shall be no appraisement of my estate, nor that my wife ~~when~~ I nominate  
 my executrix and my son Anthony Irby my executor be compelled to give security - witness  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty ninth day of November one thousand  
 and eight hundred and ten
