In the Name of God Amen I Braxton Harrison of Charles City County being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do declare and ordain this to be my last will and testament revoking all wills hitherto made. To wit: I give and bequeath to my niece Elizabeth Collier Harrison the sum of one thousand ^{pounds} Virginia currency to be paid to her in three equal annual payments the first to commence twelve Months after my death and so on until the whole is paid off. My servant Harry, my side board and two of the best beds with their furniture compleat to her and her heirs forever. To Lucy Davidson legitimate daughter of Lucy Davidson deceased should she arrive to the age of eighteen years or marry, two Negro girls of her own age or the value thereof in money, to her and her heirs forever, also she is to be educated and maintained at the expence of my estate until she arrives to the age above stated, or married; To my friend William E. Major I give the choice of my Horses, my Riding Chair Saddle & bridle, together with all my wearing apparel he may think worthy his acceptance, to him also all the spirits, coffee and sugar that may be in the house, at the time of my death, the residue of my estate, both real and personal I give and bequeath to my Nephew, Braxton Harrison when he arrives to the age of twenty one years, and not before, the whole to be under the entire Management of his Father Collier Harrison, who is at liberty to sell any part of the stock or furniture or even Negroes provided he replaces their value, to his son when he arrives to the age of twenty one years. It is my wish after my niece receives her legacy my Brother, have the profits of my plantations. The land I purchased of Francis Christians estate, to be sold in order to enable my Brother, to raise the second or 3^d payment of his daughters legacy. As Witness, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine. Now & Middleton, to be sold on 12 Months credit

At a Monthly Court held for Charles City County at the Courthouse on Thursday the twentieth day of July 1809. The aforewritten last will and testament of Braxton Harrison deceased was this day presented in Court by Collier Harrison which being offered for proof and there being no subscribing Witnesses to the same, thereupon came Cornelius Eymon and Alexander Harrison who being duly sworn deposed and said that they were well acquainted with the said Harrison and with his hand writing that they have frequently seen him write and that the said ^{will} and testament is wholly written by the said Harrison thereupon the said will is ordered to be recorded and is truly recorded. And on the Motion of Collier Harrison who entered into bond and security in the penalty of twenty thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law. Certificate is granted him for obtaining
